Relatedly, SDTA and the District have been engaged in exploratory work with the California Labor-Management Initiative and their partner organizations to improve our conversations and the ways we partner together to make decisions. It will not be a simple transition, but my hope is that it will be one that rewards our members and our students.

BARGAINING UPDATE

The SDTA Bargaining Team has reached a Tentative Agreement with the District on a contract. Highlights of the agreement are:

- **2 year agreement** with limited "reopeners" for 2019-2020.
- **3.5% increase** to schedules A, B, and C (and department chair and master's stipends)
- Maintenance of current benefits
- New standards-based evaluation system and rubrics for school counselors
- New language to allow for a 3-year evaluation cycle for those who qualify under Ed Code.
- Incorporation of EPAA side letter into the main contract
- Indexing of sub coverage rate to the actual sub rate (25% for one period, 50% for a block)
- New activities stipends, adjusting for activities directors' responsibilities and for some additional stipend positions
- New higher stipend level for WL department chairs whose departments have 41 or more sections and a committee to establish criteria for counting sections toward

stipends and apply higher level to other departments

- New committees: health benefits, PD, TIDE
- Agreement that if ILS or STARS classes or caseloads go beyond 14 SDTA and the District will meet to problem solve.
- And more

SDTA's Legislative Council will review the Agreement at their October 9th meeting and vote to bring it forward to members for ratification. Look for a site meeting to be scheduled after that and a vote to take place the week of October 15th.
